EADA Business School is in the global top 20 for executive education

 The Barcelona cluster has three schools ranked among the 20 best schools in the world

Barcelona, 20 May 2024. EADA Business School has consolidated its position alongside some of the top business schools in the world in the *Executive Education 2024* ranking, published today by the *Financial Times*. EADA Business School is ranked 16 in the classification, a privileged position it has maintained since 2023. The ranking also highlights the school's internationalisation with a top five position (5) for its high percentage of international students.

The ranking is compiled by the Financial Times and takes various aspects into account such as faculty, methodology, diversity and internationalisation of participants and facilities. According to Jordi Díaz, Dean and director general of EADA Business School, "in such a global competitive context, being able to maintain such a strong position and attract so many participants from all over the world reflects our strategy of international excellence".

In the Corporate Programmes category, the school has moved up one position compared to last year (46).

Barcelona has strengthened its position worldwide as a cluster for executive education with three schools ranked in the top 20.

EADA Business School Barcelona was founded in 1957 by a group of entrepreneurs and professionals as an ideologically and economically independent institution. As well as appearing in the well-known international rankings of the Financial Times and The Economist, it holds the EQUIS accreditation from the EFMD (European Foundation for Management Development) and the AMBA, which recognises the quality of MBA programmes.
